RE: ORDINANCE #2022-OR6 – AUTHORIZING LIMITED AGENT FOR PARK BOARD – FOR LIMITED PURPOSE OF DENYING ENTRY

Mayor Estok introduced the ordinance. Jeff Berg made a motion to approve the ordinance. The motion was seconded by Don Kring and passed by a vote of Four (4) ayes and No (0) nays

ORDINANCE #2022 OR 6

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF KNOX COMMON COUNCIL AUTHORIZING THE KNOX POLICE DEPARTMENT TO ACT AS THE LIMITED AGENT FOR THE BOARD OF PARKS AND RECREATION FOR THE LIMITED PURPOSE OF DENYING ENTRY.

WHEREAS, pursuant to I.C. § 36-10-3-3.1 and City of Knox Code of Ordinances §1120, the Board of Parks and Recreation is empowered to exercise general supervision and rules for the Board of Parks and Recreation, amongst other powers and duties more fully described in I.C. §§ 36-10-3-10 and 36-10-3-11; and

WHEREAS, the City of Knox Code of Ordinances § 1120, et al. provides the rules and regulations for the Board of Parks and Recreation; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with I.C. § 35-43-2-2(b), the Board of Public Works, at the request of the Board of Parks and Recreation, desires to appoint the Knox Police Department as its agent for the limited purpose of denying entry, as defined in the above referenced statute, to any person in violation of a State Statute, a City of Knox Code of Ordinance, or for any other lawful purpose deemed necessary by the Knox Police Department; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF KNOX COMMON COUNCIL AS RECOMMENDED BY THE BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS AT THE REQUEST OF THE BOARD OF PARKS & RECREATION OF THE CITY OF KNOX, INDIANA, AS FOLLOWS:

1. That the Board of Public Works, at the request of the Board of Parks and Recreation, does hereby appoint the Knox Police Department as its agent for the limited purpose of denying entry, as defined in I.C. § 35-43-2-2(b), to any person in violation of a State Statute, a City of Knox Code of Ordinance, or for any other lawful purpose deemed necessary by the Knox Police Department.
2. This Ordinance shall be effective upon adoption and passage and shall remain in full force and effect from and after passage and approval by the City of Knox Common Council unless and until revoked by the City of Knox Common Council and said revocation is delivered to the Knox Police Department and officially receipted thereafter.
